### G. Peter Gasteen attended NFSS from 1937 to 1944

Another memory is of shot-up British and American aircraft being driven on trucks up James Street past the school in 1943 and 1944 after being unloaded at the New Farm wharves. There was always plenty of aircraft engine noise from mainly American aircraft based at Eagle Farm which took off in the general direction of the school. The New Farm wharves were busy at the time mainly docking warships.

### Joy Boyle (nee Burnham) attended NFSS 1943 to 1944

I'll always remember on parade one day the headmaster Mr Currie (ex Colonel Currie) was complaining about children writing on the toilet walls. So he told us that when he was at Niagara Falls, amongst all the names, was written "Fools names and faces are often seen in public places." He was a colourful character and I liked and respected him.

## Notes of 1943

### Our Nation

- General Douglas MacArthur, reviewing his year in Australia, referred to the "Brisbane Line", claiming that Australia's plans before his arrival envisaged northern Australia in the hands of the Japanese.
- Butter and household drapery rationed.
- Task force in the disguised fishing boat *Krait* blew up seven ships in Singapore Harbour, and returned to Exmouth Gulf without loss.
- Zoot suits made their appearance in defiance of austerity regulations.

### Our State

- A Japanese submarine 17 kilometres east of Stradbroke Island torpedoed the hospital ship *Centaur*. There were 268 lives lost when the 3 222 ton hospital ship sank off Cape Moreton in 3 minutes. The ship was on its way to the war zone and carried no patients.

### Our Capital City

- Special defence installations were in use at Balmoral, Hemmant, Colmslie, Mt. Gravatt and Victoria Park.

### Our Neighbourhood, Our School

- NFSS was set up as the official First Aid Post for the district in a sand-bagged and blacked-out area under the Infant school. Regular first-aid and home nursing classes were held as well as air raid drills and practice for emergency treatment of casualties.
- The District Inspector wrote to the Director-General of Education drawing attention to the fact that there was only one stairway leading from the upper floor and requesting that provision be made for an emergency stairway or escape ladder in case of fire. He received a reply of "will consider". (A second stairway was eventually built in 1964.)

Report Card 1943.

During the war years, small report cards were used to save paper.

### Our Nation

- Liberal Party of Australia founded at a conference of 18 anti-Labor organizations convened in Canberra by R.G. Menzies. (Party formally constituted at another conference in Albury in Dec).
- *The Lawsons* (later *Blue Hills*) radio serial, by Gwen Meredith, began on the ABC.
- Cruising Yacht Club of Australia formed in Sydney.
- 97 merchant ships sunk or damaged in Australian and New Guinea waters.
- Meat rationing began.
- Only one or two eggs available per household each week, milk supplies were rapidly dwindling.
- Army 'callup' notices were served on 500 striking miners in NSW.
- Japanese prisoners of war broke out of the POW camp at Cowra NSW. 234 were killed and 108 were wounded.

### Our State

- Fred Paterson, the only Communist to be elected to an Australian parliament, won the seat of Bowen in the Qld state election.
- Free public hospital service began in Qld.

### Our Capital City

- Brisbane's population was boosted by up to another 70 000 as service personnel were posted to the city.
- Jazz and jitterbugging became popular and dancehalls such as the Trocadero, Riverview and Cantrell's Ballroom were always packed.

### Our Neighbourhood, Our School

- School closed ½ day on 8 Aug for the march of the Seventh Division returned from the War.
- School closed ½ day on 13 October for annual QSPSAAA Sports Day.

## Notes of 1945

### Our Nation

- Duke of Gloucester replaced Lord Gowrie as Governor-General.
- VE Day (8 May) celebrated in Australian cities.
- Australia signed the United Nations Charter in San Francisco.
- J.B. Chifley, elected leader of the Labor Party, replaced F.M. Forde as Prime Minister.
- Department of Immigration created with A.A. Calwell as Minister.
- VJ Day - Japan surrendered, ending the war in the Pacific.
- General MacArthur accepted the Japanese surrender on board USS Missouri in Tokyo Bay, with Australian representatives in attendance.
- Sydney-Hobart yacht race was held for the first time (winner Ranni).
- Lowest temperature ever recorded in Australia: -8° at Charlotte Pass, Mount Kosciusko on 14 July.

### Our State

- A Douglas DC3 crashed at Horn Island; 6 were killed.

### Our Capital City

- The war was over but rationing and restrictions continued as the city reorientated itself from the war effort to peacetime needs.

### Our Neighbourhood, Our School

- Additional holidays were granted on the following days:  
9 May - V.E. Day; 7 June ½ day - Arrival of Duke of Gloucester; 11 June - Children's display for Duke of Gloucester; 20, 21, 22 Aug - Holidays to celebrate Victory in the Pacific.

### Gloria McKay (nee Davidson) attended NFSS from 1943 to 1945

Miss Suttie and how she insisted on, and got, honesty from us all - and the wonderful tailored suits she always wore with the triangular stitching at the top of each pleat. And how I cried when she was transferred and that from a girl who was terrified when I heard I was going into her class.



## Notes of 1946

### Our Nation

- Weekly magazine the *Australasian* became the *Australasian Post*.
- Commonwealth Employment Service began.
- Trans-Australia Airlines (TAA) began operations with a daily service between Melbourne and Sydney.
- Federal government approved a proposal to set up a guided-missile range in Australia as a joint venture with the UK.
- Lance Hill of Adelaide began producing the Hills Hoist rotary clothes line.

### Our State

- F.A. Cooper resigned to become Lt-Governor, and Treasurer E.M. Hanlon succeeded him as Premier.

### Our Capital City

- An acute shortage of housing in Brisbane forced families to live in makeshift housing camps. Camps were located at Holland Park, New Farm, Lang Park, Victoria Park and Kalinga. The camp at Shorncliffe was called 'White City' as people lived in tents or from scrap materials.

- Queensland Institute of Medical Research was established in Brisbane.

### Our Neighbourhood, Our School

- Special Holidays: 10 Oct - Arrival of new Governor Sir John Lavarack; 29 Nov - Granted by Minister for Public Instruction on the occasion of his visit to the school.

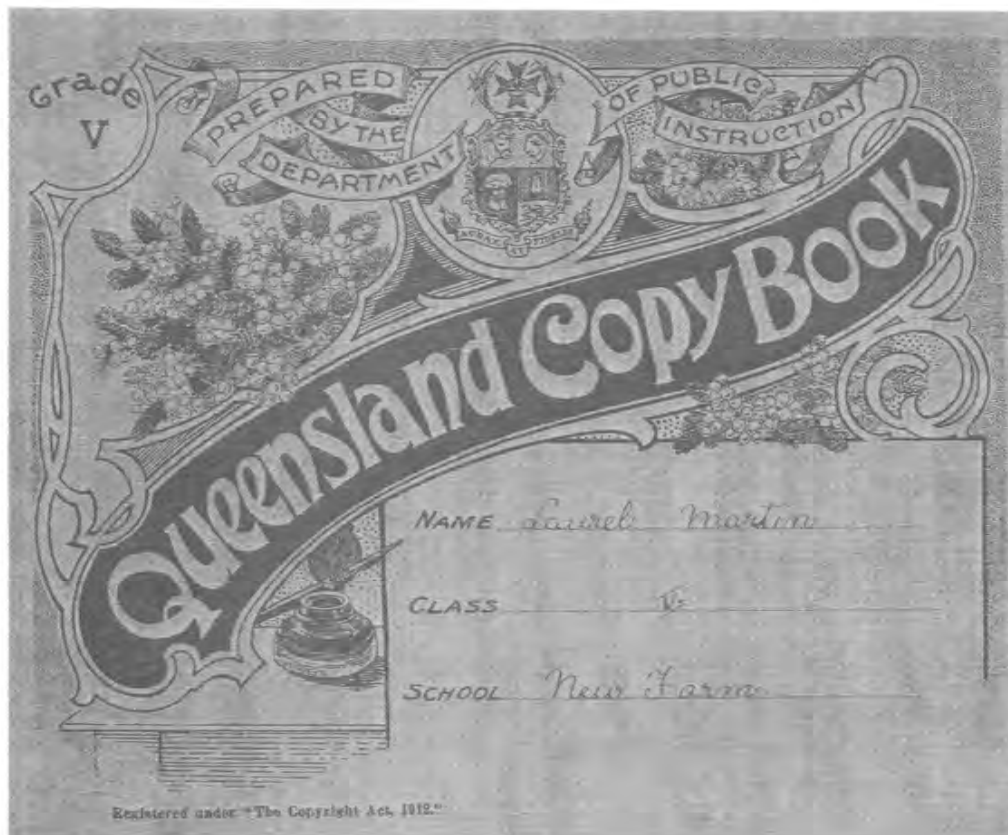

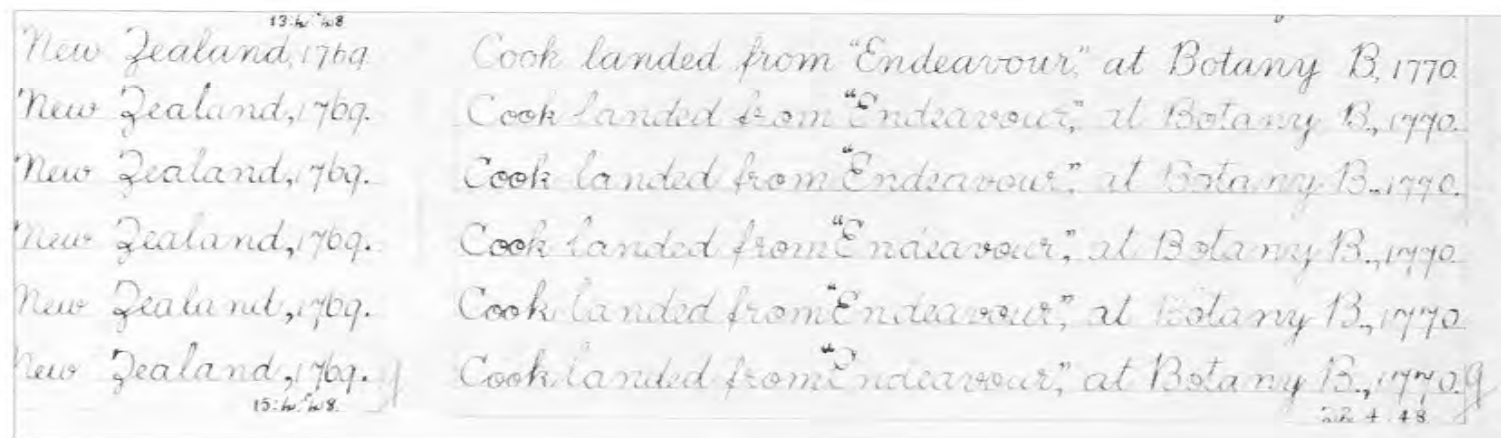

### Our Nation

- W.J. (later Sir William) McKell succeeded the Duke of Gloucester as Governor-General.
- ABC began an independent radio news service.
- Australian Regular Army formed.
- Long Range Weapons Establishment (now Weapons Research Establishment) was set up at Salisbury, SA, with a rocket range at Woomera.
- First visit to Australia of an Indian cricket team.

### Our State

- Sixteen people killed and 38 injured when a speeding train derailed at Camp Mountain.

### Our Capital City

- Luna Park on the crest of Bowen Hills was renamed Cloudland and became the social scene for Brisbane's youthful generation.
- Pineapple growers established the Golden Circle Cannery.
- Queensland Symphony Orchestra was formed.

### Our Neighbourhood, Our School

- Special Holidays: 15 July - Visit of Viscount Montgomery; 20 Nov - Marriage of HRH Princess Elizabeth.

### Our Nation

- First Holden motor car came off the assembly line. Publicly displayed and named on 29 Nov.
- Wheat Industry Stabilization Act provided for a five-year stabilization plan with a guaranteed price to growers.

### Our State

- Qld railway workers went on strike for increased pay; State government responded by legislating to give the government and police power to deal with emergencies.
- State of Emergency declared on 27 April.

### Our Neighbourhood, Our School

- Special Holidays: 15 Nov - Granted for school by Hon W.M. Moore MLA; 19 Nov - Birth of Prince Charles.

Fancy Dress Balls at the City Hall - we were well drilled with a number of ballroom dances. We all had a printed programme with our pre-selected partner's name recorded beside each dance.

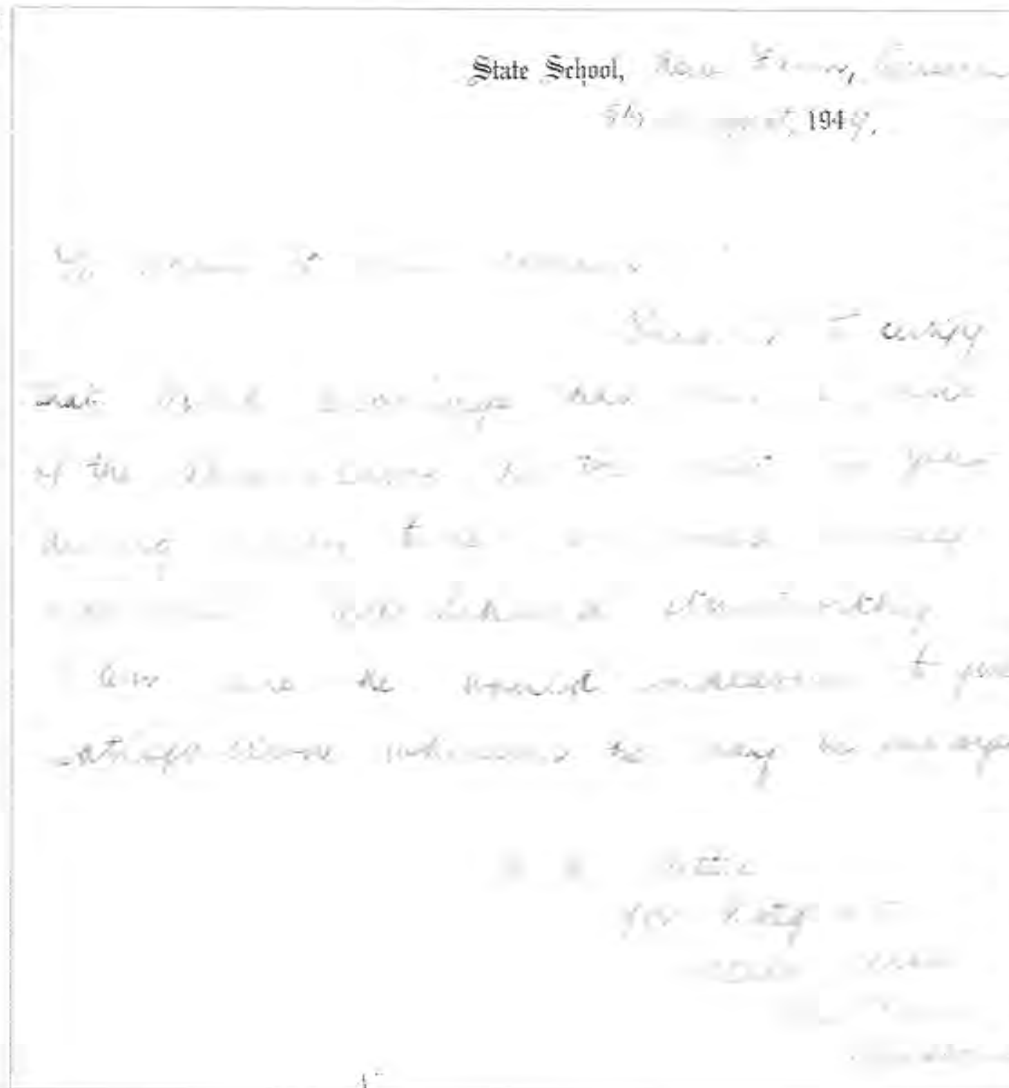

### Our Nation

- Nationality and Citizenship Act came into force, creating the status of "Australian citizen".
- Snowy Mountains Hydro-Electric Authority established by act of parliament.
- Work began on the Snowy Mountains Scheme on 17 Oct.
- Poliomyelitis epidemic in most states.
- During the year the 100 000th British migrant arrived and the 50 000th European displaced person since the end of the war arrived in Australia.
- Donald Bradman was knighted (Sir Donald Bradman).
- First episode of *Blue Hills* was heard on ABC radio, written by Gwen Meredith.
- Voting rights were given to Aborigines who served in the armed forces.

### Our State

- Severe cyclone damaged Rockhampton, Gladstone and Bundaberg and four lives lost.

### Our Capital City

- The Queensland Chamber of Manufacturers staged their first Queensland Industries Fair at the R.N.A. Showgrounds to showcase their products. Admission prices were 2/- for adults and 6d for children.

### Our Neighbourhood, Our School

- Head Teacher requested that drains be cleaned out as water was running into neighbour's property. "It is more than children's work to clean out these drains as they now are."
- Request made for taping that had been put on windows during the War to be removed.
- Head Teacher also requested that repairs be made to school gates and fences because "school cleaner never knows what she is going to find on the verandah" - empty rum bottles, milk bottles, cigarette packets and used matches.

### Our Nation

- Prime Minister Menzies announced that two RAN ships - the frigate *Shoalhaven* and the destroyer *Bataan* - would be placed at the disposal of the UN in Korea (North Korea having invaded South Korea on 25 June).
- Australian Government announced that ground troops would be sent to Korea.
- CSIRO successfully released the rabbit virus disease myxomatosis in the Murray Valley.
- Commonwealth introduced a free milk scheme for school children.
- "Bodgies" and "widges" first noted in newspapers.
- Lake Eyre filled with water - the first time to be observed by Europeans.

### Our State

- A cyclone moving south from Qld to Sydney killed 7 people and caused widespread damage.

### Our Capital City

- Although the traditional British migrants were still arriving in Brisbane, increasing numbers of Greeks, Italians and Baltic people were joining them thus setting the stage for multicultural social, political and food differences.

### Our Neighbourhood, Our School

- School assembled on Hawthorne Street side of building because of chilly weather. While assembled in this unaccustomed place, the 50ft flagpole on top of the Monument crashed to the ground where hundreds of school children normally would have been standing.

### Denise McManus (nee Clarke) attended NFSS from 1951 to 1959

Miss Suttie taught the whole school ball-room dancing on the dirt playground. We were in big circles and the loud speaker was blaring all over the neighbourhood.

We spent hours and hours throwing and catching the tennis balls on the beams under the school. We called it playing "beam". It must have given us excellent eye/hand coordination. In my lower grades, the whole school went on a picnic on the last day of school in December. Parents also came along. We boarded a train near the wharves and it took everyone to Shorncliffe. I remember we were always given watermelons and ice creams.

Every day we spent reciting (rote learning) as a class group a variety of rhymes, tables and facts. These were written in large print on charts.

We always had a set place to sit and this was according to your results in the last exam with the top achiever at the back. There were long desks and forms with no back in them. Those on the ends had the responsibility of lifting the forms back or forward in unison with the row lifting their bottoms. We had to sit all day with our back up straight and with no support. Ink wells in the desks had to be filled by monitors and those Copy Books were a challenge for some. I remember being terrified of visits by the "Inspector".

- In Qld, thousands of sheep and cattle died in bushfires which burned out 3 million ha over 8 weeks. Areas affected included Charleville, Cunnamulla, Wyandra, Quilpie and Adavale.
- The Qld tropical interior experienced floods.

### Our Capital City

- Brisbane trolley buses began operation.
- Only one third of migrants were now British.
- New migrants to Brisbane had their families split to allow for women and children to stay at the Wacol camp, and the males were housed close to work that had been allocated to them.

### Our Neighbourhood, Our School

- Head Teacher requested bicycle racks - enough for 80 bicycles.
- Purchase of two Resto Settees - one for each Teachers' Room (Male and Female).
- From 1901 to 1950 School records show that the families attending the school included the following Religious Denominations: Church of England, Roman Catholic, Presbyterian, Methodist, Congregational, Plymouth Brethren, Seventh Day Adventist, Gospel Hall, Assembly of God, Jewish, Muhammadan, Dutch Reform, Christadelphian, Church of Christ, Greek Orthodox, Lutheran, Jehovah's Witness, Salvation Army, Joyful News Mission, Christian Scientist, Agnostic, Covenant Christian Church.

- Request for adequate lighting in Infant School rooms - very dreary during dull days. Clear glass panels inserted in windows and the jacaranda tree lopped.

## Notes of 1953

### Our Nation

- Armistice signed at Panmunjom ended fighting in Korea.
- Sydney's *Sunday Herald* and *Sunday Sun* merged to form the *Sun-Herald*, following the purchase by the Fairfax organization of a controlling interest in Associated Newspapers.
- Britain exploded the first of two nuclear devices at Emu Field, Woomera.
- Royal commission appointed to inquire into the proposed establishment of television.
- Australia proclaimed sovereignty over the resources of its continental shelf.
- Melbourne Cricket Ground was chosen as the main stadium for the 1956 Olympics.
- CSIRO estimated that myxomatosis had wiped out 80% of the rabbit population in Eastern Australia.

### Our State

- In the election Labor won 50 seats, its best result ever. The opposition forces fell to 15 Country Party and 8 Liberals plus 2 Independents.

### Our Capital City

- People of Brisbane turned out in the thousands to see the Redex Trial cars travel through Brisbane and check in at the Exhibition Grounds. The reliability trial seized the public's imagination and made Redex a household name.

### Gina Armstrong (Regina Hoare) attended NFSS from 1953 to 1960.

On Friday afternoons we had activities. The one thing that stands out for me was "Red Cross". I had very little interest in the bandaging and making slings and all that wrapping, folding, tying and cutting. It was the uniform! It was

hand-me-down but I loved that starched white veil with the red cross that you fiddled with until you got that cross correctly placed in the centre of your forehead. The white dress was good too but the veil was the compelling draw card.

Other volunteers who came into the school were the religious teachers - usually the local ministers. Mr Summers from the Fortitude Valley Church took religious instruction. He was the most wonderful story-teller. He wove his fishing



and holiday adventures in with all the Old Testament stories and we were spellbound. Esau, Jacob, Cain and Abel, burning bushes and sacrifices, dreams, Joseph and his coat of many colours, prodigal sons and Good Samaritans, fields of wheat and lean and fat years, Judas, Herod, Christ, nails and crosses. I liked it better than Enid Blyton!

Wherever you are Reverend Summers, thank you for enriching my life in this way.

Miss Suttie had a reputation of getting everyone through Scholarship. Nobody but nobody mucked up for Miss Suttie. I remember my first introduction to Miss Suttie when about half the school was squeezed into the two rooms. The concertina doors open wide for a singing practice for a big event. It was all a bit chaotic and rowdy. Miss Suttie stood up on the table. I thought this was very funny but a hushed silence fell and Miss Suttie conducted the singing and made the doh ray signs.

The school ball was the highlight of the school year. I have been eternally grateful to Miss Suttie for teaching us the Waltz, the Veleta, The Gypsy Tap and the Barn Dance. I still remember the instructions. "Slide, slide, step through slide, back, back step through back - and turn and turn and turn and ready." I was somewhat uncoordinated and that detailed and thorough instruction from Miss Suttie made an enormous difference to my self-confidence.

The Annual School Ball! What memories they evoke! In grade eight, we didn't wear fancy dress but got new frocks. Nylon was all the go and I was so proud of my flock-nylon dress with a scooped neckline and full skirt, taffeta petticoat, stockings and suspender and first brassiere as my mother called it. It was terribly itchy and hot but for some perverse reason we Queenslanders persevered with nylon for years. Maybe because it didn't need ironing. I remember the endless marching practice for the Grand Parade that heralded the night's festivities, groups breaking off and going this way and that underneath cane archways held at each end by pupils and festooned with streamers and balloons.

The other big events in the fifties were the Royal Visits. The Queen visited in the year after her coronation - 1954. I have kept a copy of the Coronation booklet we were all given as a memento of her visit. Princess Alexandra came in 1959. I remember the waiting for hours and hours in the fierce sun. I remember once when Miss Suttie unfurled the cracked Map of the World from its place in the map corner and pointed as we chanted "The sun never sets on the British Empire".

Thank you Miss Suttie for making me love words and for putting such a lot of effort into making us use them correctly. I loved Latin Roots - porto, portatus. I carry and then the list of words derived from the Latin root. Transport, deport, port which every school child carried and so on.

"Unique, one of a kind - unique has no qualification - it cannot be more, less, most or rather." No one else remembers this. We learned sentences demonstrating the proper use of commonly confused and misused words and I can still conjure up a number of them. We learned grammar. We knew about Parsing, subjects and predicates, objects and ordinary old nouns, verbs, and adjectives. Never say never unless you mean not ever!

### Our Nation

- Queen Elizabeth II, the first reigning monarch to visit Australia, arrived in Sydney with Prince Philip for a visit.
- Vladimir Petrov defected from the Soviet Embassy in Canberra and sought political asylum in Australia.
- South-East Asia Collective Defence Treaty and Pacific Charter signed at Manila, leading to the creation of the South-East Asia Treaty Organization (SEATO).
- Treatment plant opened at Rum Jungle uranium mine, Northern Territory.
- John Landy broke two world records, running a mile in 3 min 58 sec, and 1 500 metres in 3 min 41.8 secs.

### Our State

- Qld was hit by severe floods, with 10 lives lost at Rockhampton.
- Qld's sugar refineries employed 8% of the state's manufacturing labour force while cane growing absorbed 19% of those in the primary production workforce.

### Our Capital City

- In March Queen Elizabeth visited Brisbane for the first time. The highpoint of the visit was the school children's rally at the Exhibition Grounds. Ten thousand children staged a tableau which spelt out the words 'Our Queen ER'.

### Our Nation

- First power generated by the Snowy Mountains Scheme, from the Guthega power station, was fed into the NSW electricity system.
- Advance party of Australian troops left for Malaya to become part of the British Commonwealth Strategic Defence Force in South-East Asia.
- Ray Lawler's play *The Summer of the Seventeenth Doll* first produced in Melbourne by the Union Theatre Repertory Co.
- Millionth post-war migrant arrived in Nov.
- Lew Hoad and Rex Hartwig won the Wimbledon doubles.
- Barry Humphries character *Edna Everidge* was introduced.

### Our State

- Huge deposits of bauxite discovered at Weipa, Cape York, by geologist Henry J. Evans.

### Our Capital City

- Rock and Roll music created wide spread concern as a youth culture developed around the music. 'Bodgies and Widgies', the films 'Blackboard Jungle' and 'Rock around the Clock' all commanded the attention of the police. Bill Haley, The Platters and Laverne Baker all performed at the Stadium.

### Our Neighbourhood, Our School

- Severe plague of bird lice in Infants building and main building.
- Windows in Infants building were a constant source of trouble - one blown off hinges and crashed to ground.

*Russell Clark attended NFSS from 1947 to 1955*

Good teachers, especially Martin Haley. An article from the *Courier Mail* pays tribute to Martin Haley, a teacher at NFSS from 1945 until 1970. Mr Haley was one of the outstanding literary figures of his time. "Say what you think in the world of everyday, but in the world of writing, think twice before you say."

### Our Nation

- Britain conducted two nuclear tests (*Operation Mosaic*) at the Monte Bello Islands. (Second, on 19 June, raised a radioactive cloud that drifted over the mainland).
- Channel TCN-9 in Sydney launched Australia's first regular television service. (GTV-9 in Melbourne began transmission on 27 Sept, ABC on 5 Nov).
- *Woman's Day*, formed by the amalgamation of *Woman* and *Woman's Day* and *Home*, began publication.
- Australian winners at Melbourne's Olympic Games: Athletics, Betty Cuthbert (100m and 200m), Shirley Strickland (80m hurdles), women's team (4 x 100m relay); Swimming, Dawn Fraser (100m freestyle), Lorraine Crapp (400m freestyle), Murray Rose (400m and 1500m freestyle), David Thiele (100m backstroke), men's team (4 x 200m relay); Cycling, I. Browne and A. Marchant (200m tandem).

### Our State

- Qld shearers went on strike for 10 months after the Industrial Commission cut shearing rates. The shearers won the strike because the employers were not united.
- Qld's Darling Downs suffered severe floods and Cyclone *Agnes* hit Qld in March. Four drowned in inland floods. Damage was estimated at £2.5 million in Cairns and £1 million in Townsville.

### Our Capital City

- David Thiele became the first Queenslander to win a Gold Medal at the Melbourne Olympic Games. Other Queenslanders to win medals were Hector Hogan and Norma Croker.

### Our Neighbourhood, Our School

- Infants Play Area in very poor condition - holes up to and exceeding 1 foot in depth and large rocks protrude 9 inches above ground. Area spread with decomposed granite.

My Dad was Rev. Samuel Summers who presented Religious Instruction at NFSS from 1937-1966.

I have fond memories of swinging from fronds of the large palm tree near the infants' school at the back and making chains from the flowers of the beautiful jacaranda tree near there.

Very little was spent on education and yet we did not seem to want for anything. There were very few, if any, extra-curricular activities but we all had an excellent grounding in the 3Rs which put us all in good stead for the future.

I did enjoy the trip to West End for Domestic Science, mapping and, in later years, ballroom dancing with Miss Meg Suttie but most of all the music lesson each week with Mr Alan Moxey and Miss Helene Baird at the piano.

Mr Innes was my teacher in Grade 5 and he taught a large number in a double classroom. I always seemed to be standing outside the door for talking too much - invariably each

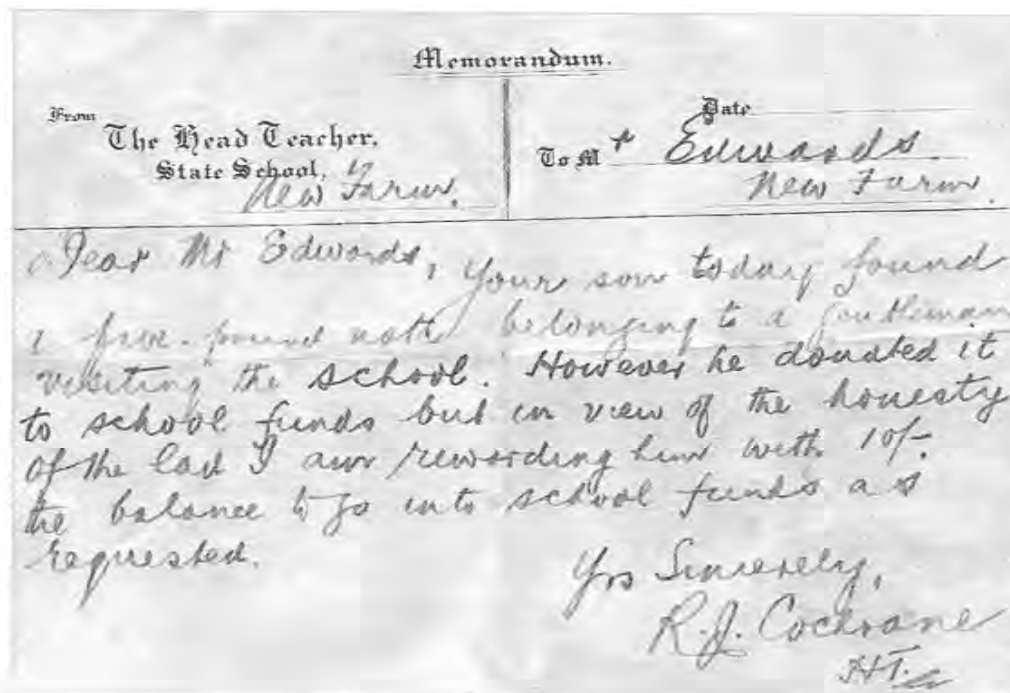

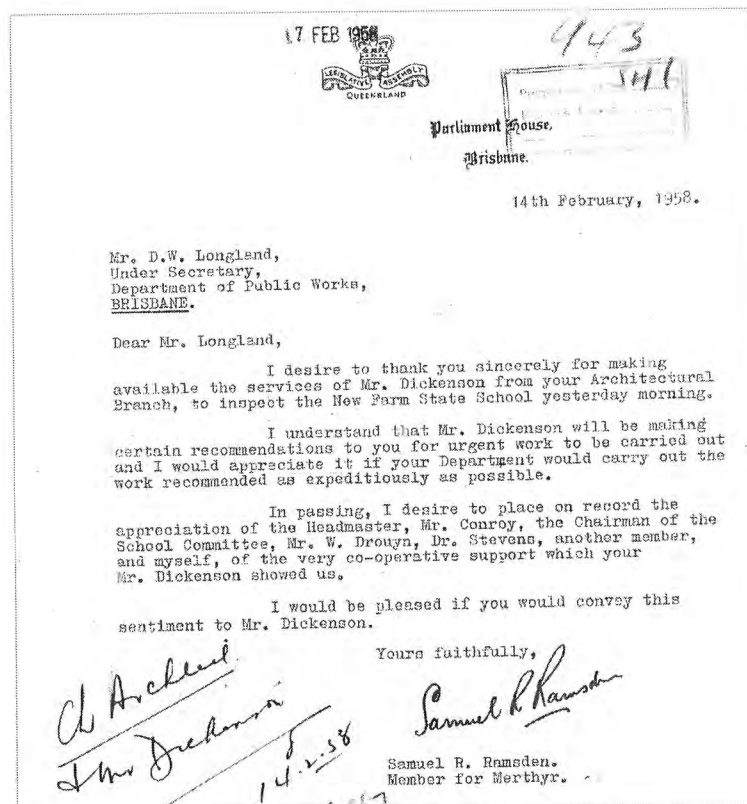

### Lynette Wicks (nee Smart) attended NFSS from 1959 - 1965.

I remember on my first day at school, the entire new grade ones had name tags pinned to their clothing then they were divided into two groups. One large group became Miss Goforth's class and the much smaller one became Miss O'Brien's composite class. I was in the second group. We were then taken to the Infants Building and shown the infants' playground, which was behind the infants' school and took up part of the present pool area. There was a long boat swing, a large double-seated swing, monkey bars, slippery slide and seesaws. There was at least one jacaranda tree with wooden seats around it.

We were shown the drinking trough under the

building and the seating area. We were taken into a classroom that was full of little double wooden desks and small wooden chairs. The desks had two hinged tops one for each pupil. After all the children were seated, we were instructed to open the desks, and there, inside was a large cardboard box which we were asked to take out. Much about school time was revealed upon opening the box. The contents included a framed lead slate, a slate pencil, a packet of six different coloured plasticine sticks and a new Happy Venture Reading Book, the stories of Nip the dog, Fluff the cat, Dick and Dora, Jane, Jack and others.

Every morning a Pauls' truck would deliver crates of little bottles of milk, one for each pupil at the school. Even though it was put in

the shade, sometimes the milk would stand for hours before being handed out at little lunch. I was never able to drink warm milk and devised several ways to get rid of it before returning the empty bottle and going on to play. In the seven years of having warm milk given to me, I was caught only once exchanging my full bottle for an empty with another student.

After mastering the alphabet and numbers on our slates (which were cleaned by spit, rags, hand rubbing or a shirt sleeve) we moved on to writing in exercise books, the ones with large red, blue and dotted lines.

Although there was a school uniform, a maroon coloured tunic, round neck, and worn over a light blue blouse, there was no enforcing of wearing it. So only a few children actually owned

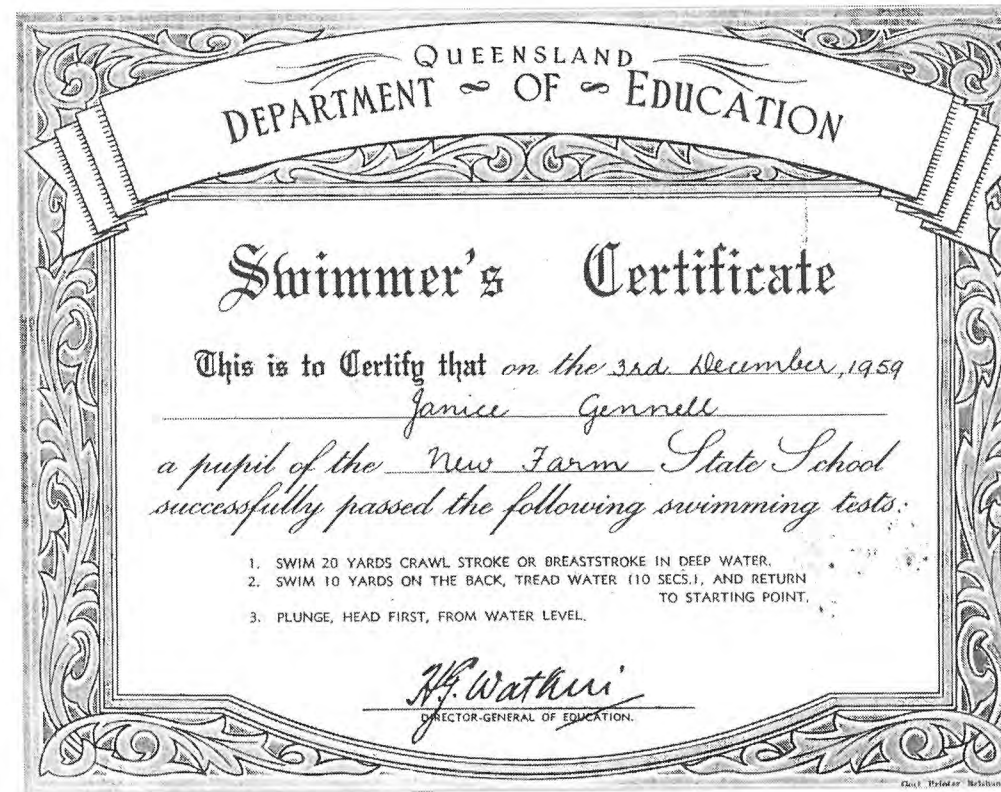

a uniform and most of those were in the fife band. You couldn't be in the fife band unless you were in uniform. The school then supplied band members with epaulets and the wool ice-cream-man-like hat they wore which was dark maroon with light blue stripe.

In September, at Warana time, the annual school fete was held. The girls were asked to display their best doll in the "Queen of Dolls" competition; a jar was placed in front of the

doll for visitors to put coins in. The doll that raised the most money won. My mother used to enter the Warana theme flower arrangement, cake making and sweets competition. She used to make trays of chocolate fudge and coconut ice. She would also buy a case of apples and make toffee apples and toffee. Children's exercise books, copybooks, paintings and pastel books were also displayed.

Grade 3 was the year I really started to notice the school environment. It was my first year in big school. One of the first issues of big school was segregation by designating certain play areas for boys and others for girls. I could no longer play with many of my friends from

Grade 2 as they were boys.

As we were no longer allowed on the play equipment, new games had to be learnt. My father made me a very long skipping rope, just as he had for my older sisters, so that I could learn run in skipping. Quite a number of girls played at once, two turned the handles of the rope, while one girl ran in to skip, then another etc until there were up to five in the middle. Another skipping game was for two in the middle. It went:

"Two little dickie birds sitting on a wall, one named Peter, the other named Paul. Fly away Peter, Fly away Paul, come back Peter, come back Paul."

Another skipping chant went:

"Bread and butter, marmalade jam. What is the name of your young man?

A.B.C. etc What is his surname? A.B.C. etc What will your wedding gown be? Silks, satins, rags or bags.

What are you going to church in? Coach, carriage, wheelbarrow, dunny cart."

One game that was popular with both boys and girls was marbles. A great game of skill and chance. A circle was drawn on the ground and a marble put in the centre. Everyone had their favourite "tor" to shoot with and a few "chippies" to play poison. It also helped to know the values of "blood alleys", "gingers", "brains", "moonies" and "agates". The boys also played football and cricket, mostly barefoot.

Grade 3 saw the introduction of Copy Books, nib pens and inkwells as well as the Government printed and supplied Spelling Book, Social Studies book and the Queensland reader for Grade 3.

I think I was in Grade 4 or 5 (1962 or 1963) when we became involved in raising funds for a swimming pool at the school. I remember going door-to-door selling raffle tickets for a few years and extra efforts and stalls were at the school fete. Enough funds were raised and the pool was built and opened the year after I left. However an open day for past pupils who had helped raise funds was held. I did join the swimming club there that was held on Friday evenings.

The school desks differed in some grades: Grade 1 had double desks with hinged lid, separate wooden chairs; Grade 2 had double desks, no lid opening, books slid under top, and double seats with backs; Grade 5 and other grades had long forms, no back on seats, the desks were painted green and had inkwells in them, about 6-8 children sat along the desk (they were the most uncomfortable desks at the school); Grades 6 and 7 had chairs.

Denyce Dennis (nee Smart) attended NFSS from 1957 to 1963.

I remember parade each morning. We were lined up in classes with the boys on one side and the girls on the other. Each class had three lines. The Fife Band stood in between the girls and the boys. Once parade was over the Fife Band would start up and lead us as we all marched into class. Each class would march together, the girls followed by the boys.

I always loved the Fife Band and eventually joined it. Members of the Fife Band wore epaulettes with gold-fringed cord, a tie and a forage hat. The girls played the Fifes and the boys played the Drums and Cymbals. Each morning parade would start with the band playing "God Save the Queen". I thought that it was very prestigious to be a member of the band.

Fetes were the second highlight of the year after the Fancy Dress Balls. They were held on a Saturday usually in September. Each class would set out displays of handwriting, essays, drawings, maps etc. Each class was responsible for running a stall at the fete, and as we got older we "manned" the stall. Not only would we be busy at school preparing for the fete, but also we were extra busy at home. My mother would be busy cooking coconut ice, chocolate fudge and patty cakes that would be for sale, and she would also cook cakes to put into the "cake making" competitions. There would also be prizes for the best rose, the best gerbera etc. The biggest fundraiser for the fete was the "Queen of Dolls" competition (later there would be a King of the Teddy Bears competition as well). For weeks before the fete you would enter your doll (or Teddy Bear) into the competition. Then you would go door knocking around the neighbourhood to raise funds. The prize winner of this competition was the doll (or Teddy

Bear) which raised the most funds. There were also other prizes given. So not only would my mother be busy cooking, she would also be making outfits for dolls and teddy bears. To vote for the Queen of the Dolls (or King of the Teddies) you would put a coin in the jar. My sister, Gail and my brother Malcolm had the Queen of the Dolls and the King of the Teddies for several years running.

I think I used slates at school from Grades 1-4. Some slates were blank and some had lines etched on them. Slate pencils were sharpened by scraping them on cement. Up until Grade 4 we did not use ink at all. We only had pencils and had to write neatly or we were made to "rub it out" and do it again. We were not allowed fountain pens or biros at all. When we

did graduate to ink, we had a pen with a nib, which we had to dip into an ink bottle which was located in a hole at the top of the desk. In Grade 3, I started to learn running writing and had to use a "Copy Book". Each Grade had Copy Books and from Grade 5 onwards we wrote in ink. I still have what I call "Queensland Copy Book" handwriting.

Pastels were the forerunner of crayons but unlike crayons when you drew with them they were very "powdery". The Pastel Books had a sheet of tissue between each page.

During my time at Primary School, I think if there was a bug out there I was immunised against it. I can remember lining up waiting for the "horse needles". I can also remember that most times I was nearly always the last one to

be immunised and would watch all the kids in front of me getting "jabbed". Some would cry and some would scream and I would be getting more scared by the minute. I do remember that they hurt.

I have four brothers and four sisters who all attended NFSS from 1943 to 1970 (a period of 27 years).

In 1960, there were no State pre-schools so, as the youngest of six, I was itching to start school and try to catch up to my older siblings: no tears from me on my first day at NFSS.

My Grade 1 teacher had the evocative name of Mrs Goforth and taught, I think, all the Hoare children. My report card that year states there were 47 children in my class, a daunting concept for today's teachers. Mrs Goforth managed her large class by convincing us that she had eyes in the back of her head: she certainly managed to catch miscreants who played up whilst her back was turned. At the end of the year, she explained her secret. "Her eyes in the back of her head" were the reflections of the class in her thick spectacles whilst she worked at the blackboard.

Miss Crow, my Grade 2 teacher, was a kind, attractive young woman fresh from Teachers Training College, a contemporary of my eldest sister, Diana, and a past student of NFSS.

Miss Wilkinson, who taught me in both Grades 3 and 4, would nowadays be described as "drop-dead gorgeous"! I remember gratefully receiving praise when, at a school concert, as a member of a voice choir, I did not flinch at the praying mantis which landed on my shoulder.

Like so many others, I have a special admiration for my Grade 7 teacher, Miss Suttie. She was a gifted teacher with a fine intellect. She loved her job, which was why she was so good at it. She gave us a head start for high school by teaching us to count to 10 in French. Miss Suttie had a wonderful collection of wise sayings. I can still visualise her tapping her foot as she chanted: "The more you learn, the more you realise how little you know". And she is right!

Other snippets of sensual memories return: the Spring time school fetes and the fancy dress balls at Riverside ballroom. Unpalatable free warm

milk in triangular plastic cardboard packages often curdled after simmering in Brisbane's hot summer sun. Fresh white cream buns split and filled with sweet mock cream and a dollop of hardened strawberry jam were served by the pleasant tuckshop convenor. The pie van served meat pies, ruined in my then view, by the mushy green peas accompanying them. I preferred the apple pie in flavourless sugar dusted pastry centred with a piped dollop of mock cream.

NFSS was one of the first State schools to have the services of a specialist music teacher, Miss Jenkins, I think. She added a new dimension to the students' education in her lessons on musical appreciation. I have not yet learnt to

play a musical instrument proficiently, dropping out of New Farm's Fife and Drum Band when I got braces and could no longer wangle a squeak out of my life; but thanks in part to Miss Jenkins, music continues to bring a dimension of joy to my life. Like Miss Suttie, Miss Jenkins too had wise sayings, one of which remains with me. "Do not worry, girls and boys, about being ordinary. God specially loves ordinary people because he has made so many of them".

During the 1960s, NFSS had a serious paucity of playing fields, with only a bitumen parade ground for those rigorous morning assemblies in full sun, a gravel basketball court and a bitumen tennis court. There was no swimming pool until

## Christopher Hawke attended NFSS from 1959 to 1963

Every morning I used to walk my route to school which was to go up Kent Street, turn left into Chester Street, down part way in Gibbon Street then turn left into Beeston Street and then I went through a narrow pathway which is still there into the road which led to the school. There was then a row of houses where the oval is today and I used to walk down to the entrance which was and still is at the bottom of the school. One of my first memories was that we formed into groups from which then we were dispersed into our lessons. Another first memory I had was seeing Mr Harvey William Smith succeed Mr William Conroy as Headmaster. This was conducted at the top of the stairs which led up to a verandah which now is enclosed and is overlooking the main playground which was used for Anzac Day parades. Anzac Day was another memorable

day as we marched around the playground in formation before returning to lessons. I also can remember having lessons with the class outdoors around to the left side of the school building amongst the trees with our slate and slate pencil. I could hear the kookaburras in the trees while we had those lessons.

Many times when I came home from school, the evening was made up of watching: *Rin Tin Tin*, *Lassie*, *Tombstone Territory*, *Rawhide*, *The Lucy Show* and many more.

My mother worked in the tuckshop at break times and I can remember everytime the school bell rang, off I would go to get my Fanta orange drink.

My days at NFSS were so memorable and I still cherish those days even now. I returned to NFSS for the first time in 1994, 31 years after I left and I could not believe that I was standing next to the school that I loved.

### **Fred Windsor, a Committee member from 1962 to 1975.**

I was the last Secretary of the old School Committee from 1962 - 1964. Early in 1965 we were informed by the Education Department that we had to form a P&C Association with the Officers being elected each year. I became the inaugural President and held that position for ten years 1965 - 1975.

I have memories of the great support and co-operation I received not only from the members of the P&C but from the Teaching Staff and the general public. If my memory is correct NFSS was one of the first, if not the first, to install TV and carpets in the classrooms in spite of stiff resistance from the Education Department.

When we decided to build a swimming pool and applied for permission, we were refused point blank because the area was too small. We countered by requesting the Department resume the land below the school (which they later did for the Pre-School) or we be allowed to build a smaller size pool. Our application was again refused. The Works Department refused on the grounds it would create a precedent (which it did and other schools were later allowed to build pools to suit the area available; so at least some benefit resulted from our efforts) but at the time we were in a no-win situation.

I then asked Sam Ramsden MLA to obtain an interview with the Minister of Education, Mr Pizze. On the day of the interview the Director of Public Works was also present and things became rather tense when Sam put his job on the line. We left with a promise that our application would be reconsidered. A week later it was granted.

Now of course it was the question of finance.

If I remember correctly, we had about three thousand pounds in the bank so to get an early start we needed a loan and the bank required three suitable guarantors. I considered this was too big a burden for three and finally got nine other P&C members to join as guarantors. Then the heat was on with Fetes, BBQs and by whatever means possible to pay off the loan. Many volunteers worked so hard at fund-raising and digging trenches in sheer rock for underground power lines and holes for light poles. We achieved our goal in four years.
